Sébastien was a member of the Examination Committee of the European College of Veterinary Dermatology (ECVD) from 2017 to 2023. He has been published over 20 times and is the co-author of Dermatology of Exotic Pets. His areas of expertise are otology, and particularly the study of the tympanic membrane, lasers, and onco-dermatology.
